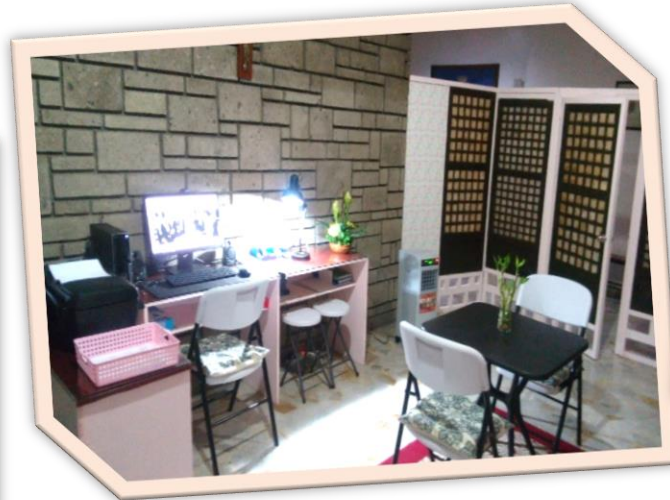

On behalf of the MSCS Asia Delegation, Sr. Eufrocina Sumampong and Sr. Roschelle Isada participated at the closing event of the Year of the Clergy and Consecrated Persons on July 15, 2018 at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Shrine, New Manila. The main celebrant of the Eucharistic celebration for the occasion was Bishop Onesto Ongtioco. Several congregations were represented as well. The event was strikingly colorful and festive.

Bishop Ongtioco read the Pastoral Letter entitled “Rejoice and be Glad” issued by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP), a reminder to Bishops on how to react on current issues as ordained ministers and an invitation to the faithful to “remain steadfast in their common vocation and mission to actively work for peace”. Rejoice and be Glad are the comforting words of Pope Francis “to those persecuted and humiliated”. In the Pastoral letter, the CBCP invited the faithful to join their Bishops in three days of fasting, prayer and almsgiving from July 17 to 19, 2018, invoking God’s mercy and justice in our country.
